

#### **Course Overview**

#### **Considering drama school?**

During this course, you will get a taste of the type of work you might experience at many of the top **UK drama schools**. This course will immerse you in the world of **Shakespeare**, equipping you with the skills and confidence to excel in **performances** and **drama school auditions**.

This course is for students with some acting experience looking to **experience drama school**. Working with the **experts from Oxford School of Drama**, you will gain a deeper understanding of **Shakespeare's language**, **character development** and **performance techniques**. Through a combination of **focused technical workshops** and **collaborative rehearsals**, you will develop a performance from **script to stage**. At the end of the two weeks, you will take part in a **showcase of the work** and will come away from this course with a fully prepared and polished piece of work **ready for auditions**.

Mornings will have an individual, **technical focus** with afternoons opening out into more **collaborative explorations of the text**. We will explore several techniques including **Uta Hagen**, **Stanislavski and Meisner** as well as **improvisation**.

Expect to be challenged, to collaborate, create, engage, and have fun. You will utterly immerse yourself in a real taste of drama school.

#### About the course

- Demystify the text: learn about Shakespeare's language, historical context, and theatrical conventions.
- How to bring meaning to the text: understanding meter, prose, and verse.
- Exploring characters: analysing characters through movement, voice, and interpretation
- Voice and movement: develop vocal expressiveness and physicality through workshops tailored to Shakespearean performance.
- Acting: voice, movement, physicality, and improvisation
- Showcase Performance: an opportunity to perform and receive feedback.

#### **Course Tutor: Sabi Perez**

Sabi trained at RADA and has experience as an actor, teacher, director, facilitator, and coach.

Sabi's acting credits include work with companies such as The Kenneth Branagh Company, The National Theatre, The Orange Tree Theatre, Penguin books and Big Fish Games. As a director she works regularly with Shakespeare, particularly creating adaptations with and for young audiences, performed at local theatres.

Sabi regularly teaches at RADA on the BA Acting and Short Courses, as well as at GSA, The BRIT School and internationally. She also teaches on the Foundation Course at the Oxford School of Drama.

Additional Staff: Specialist skills tutor. Students will also be working alongside a specialist tutor from the Oxford School of Drama to support the voice, movement and text work.
